Introduction Indonesia & International Conference on Population and Development

- Indonesia is one of the **founding members** of Partners in Population and Development (PPD) which was founded in 1994 during the International Conference on Population and Development (ICPD) in Cairo, Egypt.
- Indonesia (c.q. National Family Planning Coordinating Board (BKKBN) has received the UN Population Award 2022 as recognition for leadership in the field of population.
- •At the 57th Session of the Commission on Population and Development (CPD-57) meeting in New York, 29 April 3 May 2024, Indonesia emphasized **3 best practices of Indonesia** in implementing the PoA-ICPD:
 - 1. The importance of a population policy framework;
 - 2. Cooperation between the government and other stakeholders such as NGOs;
 - 3. Localization of population policies in the regions through Quality Family Village

• Indonesia also emphasizes the importance of **collaboration and cooperation** of all countries in collective efforts to face the challenges of population complexity and encourage the concrete achievement of the PoA-ICPD.

South-South and Triangular Cooperation (SSTC) Indonesian AID

- Up to 2020 → Indonesia organized **1,000 SSTC programs** with 13.000 participants from Asia, Pacific, Africa, Middle East, South America, Caribbean, Eastern Europe, and Central Europe regions.
- On 18 October 2019 → established Indonesian AID → Indonesian Agency for International Development (Lembaga Dana Kerjasama Pembangunan Internasional/LDKPI)
- Indonesian AID increases Indonesia's capacity beyond capacity building → assisting other countries with grants, infrastructure development, goods/products procurement, scholarship, and humanitarian aid.

Priority of Indonesian grants

- to countries with geographical proximity → to support the development of the countries with direct borders with Indonesia.
- to regions with **developing countries and LDCs**.
- to countries with the potential for **economic cooperation**.
- to support the integrity of **Indonesian sovereignty**.
- to countries **that promote democracy, and peace** and support transnational crime and terrorism combat, and radicalism eradication.

Priority regions for Indonesian grants

- **South East Asia** → implementation of ASEAN commitments, CLMV to support regional integration and narrowing development gap;
- **South Pacific** \rightarrow implementation of Indonesia's Indo-Pacific policy;
- South and Central Asia \rightarrow support the development of the region;
- **Sub-Saharan Africa** → implementation of the Indonesia-Africa Forum (IAF), Indonesia-Africa Infrastructure Dialogue (IAID), and Indian Ocean Rim Association (IORA);
- **The Middle East** \rightarrow supports peace and stability building in the region;
- Southern and Central America and, the Caribbean → support trade and investment;
- **Eastern Europeans** \rightarrow support political and cultural cooperation;
- Indo The Pacific region → supports Indonesian Maritime Vision and builds networking in the Indian Ocean and the Pacific Ocean as a Single Geo-Strategic Theatre.

Partner in SSTC

- JICA, GIZ, USAID, UNDP, IsDB, NAM CSSTC, the Governments of Norway, Netherlands, UK.
- Indonesia is finalizing its cooperation umbrella with TIKA and KOICA.

Indonesian Role in International Forum

• As Co-Chairs with Sweden, Congo, and Reality Africa AID at Global Platform for Effective Development 2023-2025.

- Indonesia SSTC programs are included in **UNOSCC** best practices Publication:
 - SME training and workshops, Disaster Risk Management, Sustaining Peace, Good Governance and Entrepreneurship (2019).
 - Training program on Empowering Small and Medium Sized Enterprises in Suriname was re-publish by UNOSSC as SSTC's best practices program for Small Islands Development States (SIDS) (2021).
 - Online training on food packaging and labeling for African, Latin American, and Caribbean Countries (2022).
 - ➢ Online training on principles and applications of integrated pest and disease management for African, Latin American, and Caribbean Countries (2022).
 - > Training of Trainers in the Climate Field Schools (2022)

Trainings held by the National Family Planning Coordinating Board (BKKBN) in 2023:

- SSTC Training on Strategic Partnership with Muslim Religious Leaders (MRLs) in Reproductive Health, Family Planning, Prevention of Gender-Based Violence, Child Marriage, and Stunting Reduction for the Asian Region. Joined by 17 participants from Burundi, Ethiopia, Myanmar, Nepal and Malaysia;
- SSTC Training on Reproductive Health, Family Planning, Adolescent Reproductive Health, and Prevention of Gender-based Violence and Child Marriage for Bangsamoro Autonomous Region of Muslim Mindanao Youth Muslim Leaders. Joined by 17 participants from the Philippines;
- Capacity Building on Maternal Health, Children, and Family Welfare Program. Joined by 20 participants from Kenya;
- Capacity building for India, on September 2023 held in Jakarta, on the topic of single-rod implant contraceptive technology.
